Jeana Ross is an Early Childhood Education Consultant and Former Secretary of the Alabama Department of Early Childhood Education (ADECE). Throughout her career Jeana Ross has created, developed, directed, and evaluated programs that have positively impacted Alabama children from birth through graduation. Ross has 28 years of public school and state government experience in Alabama with much of her time devoted to establishing quality early childhood programs. Ross's work earned the ADECE national recognition for more than doubling the state's voluntary high-quality Pre-K programming and made Alabama one of four states to meet all 10 requirements for the National Institute of Early Education Research's quality benchmarks.

Kuna Tavalin has 18 years of experience in public affairs, advocacy and strategic planning in the early childhood, education and human services arenas. His essays on public policy issues have gained national attention, and his work on early childhood levelopment has garnered numerous awards, including those from the George Lucas Educational Foundation the Minnesota Department of Health, both In 2007, and he was named 2005 Minnesotan of the Year by Minnesota Monthly magazine.
